- Recording and notification of accident in Tanzania,
- Innovation and implementation of OHS in workplaces.
- Safety and health of young workers and prevention of child labour.

## ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

Expressions of interest should be submitted in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Acceptance of proposals will be based on the submission of an abstract, to be reviewed and accepted by the Organizing Symposium Committee
- Paper presentations are limited to 45 minutes, inclusive of question time.

Abstracts will be reviewed in accordance with the following criteria:

- Presentation of the subject matter at a level appropriate to a professional OHS practitioner, demonstrating a well developed understanding and coherent description of the concepts;
- Evidence of understanding and critical analysis of the issues;
- Quality of and use of supporting literature and references including contemporary information sources or publications, in an integrated manner that substantiates the discussion/ perspective of the paper;
- A coherent discussion should be presented of current and future implications for occupational health and safety;
- Papers with evidence of product advertisement or marketing nature will not be accepted.

The abstract must have the following format:

- Introduction
- Methodology
- Results
- Discussion

### SUBMISSION PROCESS

Abstracts should be submitted in MS Word format (maximum 350 words) and be accompanied by a brief biography of the presenter(s).
